SAT in Vietnam: Flawless Results for COMSOFT's AIM System

COMSOFT announces the successful completion of site acceptance tests for their state-of-the-art Aeronautical Information Management (AIM) system in Vietnam.

The fully integrated AIM design, paired with its feature to grant authorized users access to certain documentation services such as NOTAMs, weather charts, AIPs and Search and Rescue information via a web-based application, turned VANSCORP into an operator of industry leading AIM technology in the Asia-Pacific region.

Both customer and supplier are fully satisfied with the results and keep focused on the ongoing elaborate transition process in which legacy data in various formats is being migrated into the new system database. Subsequent to its completion the system will be ready for operational use.
